Jo Davenport's work explores the intuitive tension between line. colour, text and the natural world. Through a series of mnemonic lavers. Jo's mark-making synthesizes personal narrative with symbolic gesture, creating abstracted 'maps' of emotion, time and place. Drawing inspiration from her experiences in the Australian outback, and also from an interest in Eastern aesthetic philosophy, Jo presents a holistic understanding of the world.

In this series of work Davenport traces her interest in word as image. The aesthetic quality is presented as a medley of line rather than cohesive written meaning.
